- It's harder, because you have to be fitter, run faster and hit harder It has become a lot more strategic I am enjoying playing full games and not short games or festivals. It is more challenging but I'm enjoying it more!
- Ties The club gives us our shirts We get to

use the changing rooms • We have to wear smart clothes at the weekend, but we get better food after a match

Then the parents:

- The shirts!!! Less washing! Ties! Interesting as the first time they are playing actual positions requiring different skill sets.
- It is more organised, far better to watch. Great to see the boys put into positions. Where did my baby go? It is better to watch and time wise as the boys get to play at least a half Split Squads
- It's more formal
 The boys seem to have matured already, they are taking the game more seriously and really starting to compete for places




ESHER RFC



The club was formed in 1923 when four rugby enthusiasts met in a pub and decided to form a rugby club. One of them, a Welshman insisted that the new club should adopt his native Welsh club's colours. Which is why Esher play in the same Black and Amber as Newport to this day.

At the outbreak of the Second World War, Esher had moved to its present site in Molesey Rd and were fielding eight sides, but war disrupted activities and the pitches were ploughed up for food production. Post war amazingly they ran as many as fifteen sides each Saturday!

Esher were first promoted to National League 2 South in 1998. In 2007 they were promoted to National One and again just three years later to the Championship in a



In 2013 they finished Runners up; & in the years since have always finished comfortably mid-table. Last season they finished just one spot lower than us in 9th. They have had a 'challenging' start to this accumulated just the 11 points from their six games to date. Their two wins came at home against Cambridge (17-10) & last weekend vs Cinderford (10-7).

MATCH REPORT



With a strong wind blowing the steady rain almost straight down the pitch.

Stortford played the first half against the elements and, not surprisingly had to withstand a lot of pressure, with the home backs using the wind to great effect to kick for territory. This led to extended periods with Chinnor's forwards hammering at Stortford's line, during which the visitors showed immense character and determination, as well as a lot of technique in repelling drive after drive. Stortord also showed remarkable skill in running through many phases of handling rugby through both forwards and backs to deprive the opposition of the ball, but time after time, Chinnor managed to turn the ball over and push back into the visitors' 22 with some good kicking.

The defence stood strong though and ironically, it was after another successful Stortford drive upfield that the first score came, when a penalty was given for a breakdown offence close to halfway 13 minutes into the game and flyhalf, Caolan Ryan stepped up to boot the kick over the bar with vards to spare. More Chinnor pressure led to another penalty after 30 minutes, allowing Ryan to double his side's lead. Stortford again showed great character in running through the phases to force their way out of defence and eventually a good break by Jimmy Rea in midfield took them close to the Chinnor 22, leading to a period of concerted pressure on the home line, which almost brought a try, but the ball was lost forward, as a Stortford forward stretched across the line, after a tremendous team drive. A 6-0 deficit against such a strong attacking side as Chinnor with the wind at their backs was an excellent halftime result for the visitors and just reward for some outstanding defence.

The second period started with a long Stortford dropout and a good take by Tom Walker of a clearing Chinnor kick and an immediate pass to Rea saw the winger break through the chasing

line. He then put in a pinpoint grubber kick to the opposition try line, where a good team chase forced the covering defenders over the line for a 5-metre scrum. For the first time in the game one pack managed to force the other cleanly backwards and it was the Stortford 8 that were surging forward. With a couple of meters still to go to the line, the home front row clearly collapsed the scrum and the referee had no hesitation in awarding a penalty try with barely 2 minutes of the half gone.

Stortford dominated most of the half territorially in the same way that Chinnor had in the first period and were likewise rewarded with 2 penalty goals, kicked by debutant flyhalf, Manu Vunipola after 17 and 38 minutes. Despite incurring yellow cards to Seb Brownhill for scrum offences and James Apperley for a late tackle after 8 and 39 minutes respectively, Stortford were able to see out the game, though not without a few nerves towards the end, as Chinnor showed ever more adventure in their desperation to close the deficit.

A tremendous win in a hugely hard-fought match was earned by Stortford's superb defence, taking 4 valuable league points away from high-flying Chinnor.

A second major achievement of the day needs to be recorded in the charity bike ride completed by almost 40 Stortford supporters in the hostile weather conditions to raise funds for crucial therapy treatments for Aurora Rea. Congratulations to all those that did the ride and thanks to all those who contributed sponsorship and donations to this great cause, among whom a highly honourable mention must go to the Committee and members of Chinnor, who showed huge support for the event - you did your club proud.







We've advertised this year as being the 16th Chapter in our Fireworks history but in truth it's more like the 20th. That contradiction is explained by the fact that the genesis of the event can be traced back to Saturday 7th November 1998 when, as a 5th team, 'the Mighty Fifths', we decided to let off a few boxes of 'Standard' Fireworks whilst huddled around a disposable BBQ purely for the entertainment of ourselves & our families. The following year we invited the other teams to join us and, as they say, the rest is history. This is though, the 16th time we've invited paying guests to join us for what is now certainly one of, if not the, largest display in East Herts. It has in effect become the de facto 'Town' display, regularly attracting between Three & Four Thousand people to the club.

However it hasn't always been the extravaganza we will, fingers crossed, once again enjoy on 3rd November. In the early years of its 'professionalism' in typical Stortford fashion we used to buy the industrial grade fireworks in and let them off ourselves. It seemed like a good idea until one soggy year when a few of our bigger purchases repeatedly failed to light & I made the nearly fatal mistake of returning to a previously lit rocket. As I bent over to reignite the device it went off and in doing so hit the peak of my baseball cap with such force that it knocked it off my head! That was it! From then on we brought in the professionals – Essex Pyrotechnics, but I do still insist each year on wearing my lucky cap.

Obviously safely hosting an event that attracts so many paying guests takes a lot of planning. Long gone are the days of only deciding who's buying the fireworks and who's getting the sausages the week before. Nowadays planning for next year's event will start within days of us concluding this one. The 14 strong organising committee meets at least four times in the weeks immediately preceding the event, trying to anticipate every eventuality.

Inevitably as the event has grown so have the costs associated with getting it off the ground. You simply cannot plan for welcoming, entertaining, feeding & watering 4,000 people without some prior investment. I try not to think too much about it but the reality is, it costs us nearly £13k to host. So we need to sell a lot of tickets & burgers before we break even. Bad weather – or more accurately rain is our nemesis. It can be cold but provided it's dry we know the people will come.

That's why we are so grateful to our sponsors Hanbury Wealth and long-time supporters Intercounty Estate Agents for the assistance they provide in helping to mitigate our exposure.

Cometh the day a small army of club volunteers will help us set up the site, host the display & then late into the night deconstruct it all, so we can play rugby the next day. It's a long, tiring day but one which can, provided 'the sun shines'. be very rewarding.

I don't know the exact figures but I reckon in 15 years we must have contributed at least £100k to the clubs coffers, money which, we as a committee, insist is spent on projects that will benefit the whole club.

They then form the "Players Tunnel" alongside the "Blazers" to welcome both the opposition and the 1st XV onto the pitch before the game. Their experience culminates with Post Match Photos alongside the Players.
