If you have never watched the Blues, you don't know what you're missing!

Richard and I have been supporting our son Jack and the rest of the team for four years now, ever since Jack finished university and returned to his rugby roots to play with his school and club mates here at BSRFC. There have been highs and lows, but it is the passion and commitment of the team that never fails to deliver and is infectious to all that play and follow. Well done to the coaches Danny, Faiersy and Ash for giving up their valuable time and energy to train and manage the Blues. They always make us feel welcome on match days.

You can watch the Second team for free with the payback normally being a longer walk to the pitch. Last year's Barnes away game required a ten minute walk to the furthest corner of the park and certainly no stands for protection from the elements. This adversity creates the camaraderie. friendship and fun of supporting the Blues. All of this is amplified with the away trip to Jersey staying for a few nights in The Royal Yacht Hotel. Last season's away win is one of our top highlights with Big Bird (Ross's Dad) and Radders (Ollie's Dad) sipping wine from their own two litre lemonade bottles at pitch-side and then not making dinner with us, a couple of lightweights! Faiersy's emotion at beating Jersey away after a 3am start reflected the passion that we all feel when the Blues do well.

Good luck to the Blues today, we are all hoping for a win against Chinnor to avenge the 13-7 loss back in October.





TODAY'S OPPOSITION

CHINNOR RFC



Our opponents today Chinnor RFC were founded as recently as 1962 making them the 'youngest' club in the National leagues, by a group of regulars at 'The Bird in Hand' pub in Chinnor. The pub was their unofficial HQ and 'clubhouse' for many years whilst they played matches on a field next door.

In 1971 the club moved to Towersey Playing Fields in Thame, building their very first clubhouse on the site, entirely through volunteer labour. The club quickly grew, adding Mini & Youth Rugby in 1973 and winning the Oxfordshire County Cup in 1976. Not bad for a club, that was at that point, only 14 years old!

Within a few years though the village decided they wanted their playing fields back forcing the club to look elsewhere for a permanent home. In 1987 they moved to the ten acre site at Kingsley Road which many of our supporters will be familiar with.

They won a play-off to secure their promotion to National league 2S (Level 4) in 2012 and many of you will

remember our first encounter with them which was at this level on 26th October 2013. That match at Kingsley Road was a close fought encounter with the hosts running out winners on that occasion 29-27.

That was the first of several memorable matches which we contested in the three seasons we were together in National 2 South. Chinnor were of course along with Old Elthamians & ourselves involved in a 3-way dog fight for promotion during the 2016-17 season

promotion during the 2016-17 season, a fight that thankfully resulted in us gaining the automatic promotion with OE's just pipping Chinnor to the play-off spot.

Chinnor went one better last season, securing 2nd spot In N2S & beat Sedgley Park from N2N in a high scoring home play-off, 40-31 to secure their position in National One for the very first time.

Earlier this season we won 13-6 at Kingsley Road, giving them every incentive to redress the balance today. They currently sit in a highly commendable 5th position in the table having already won no fewer than 10 of the 19 games to date.



MATCH REPORT

LOUGHBOROUGH STUDENTS 26 - 41 BISHOP'S STORTFORD 1ST XV



The visitors were soon back on the front foot and scored their second try with 10 minutes gone, when Charlie Kingham burst through the middle, almost making the line himself from 30 yards out, but quick ball saw Joss Linney in out wide. Tom Banks stepped up to make a great conversion from the touchline and the lead became 19 after 20 minutes, when James Apperley scored his second great individual try in two weeks. This time he took a short pass from George Cullen close to halfway to burst clear and once again surprised the opposition with his pace over distance, feinting passes to supporting players but outpacing the covering players to make the line with room to spare. Banks again added the extras.

The home side fought back and forced their way through their lively backs into the Stortford 22, but a good cover tackle by Cullen dislodged the ball for a crucial turnover. A breakdown penalty to Stortford shortly after was taken quickly by Banks, who ran 30 metres and, when he was hauled down some 40 metres out, another penalty quickly resulted. This produced a yellow card for Loughborough's fullback and a shot at goal for Banks, which was pulled wide.

The relief for the home side was, though short-lived, as a good take from the restart saw Nick Hankin make a clean break to run some 20 metres before feeding Rob Duff outside to run in the bonus point try with 25 minutes gone. The Students now showed real character, battling their way into the game and giving the visitors' pack a hard time in the scrums, causing the referee to award a series of penalties. This took Loughborough steadily upfield, despite some tremendous tackling by Stortford. Eventually, the official lost patience and, following another penalty at a scrum on the 5 metre line, sin-binned Seb Brownhill. Unsurprisingly, Loughborough opted for another scrum and a further Stortford offence produced a penalty try to take the halftime score to 7-24.

The home side started the second half strongly, but were held at bay by solid Stortford defence and, with 5 minutes gone, a loose home pass in midfield was seized on quickly by George Cullen, who had the pace

to run the ball in for a fifth try, giving Banks a relatively easy conversion.

Loughborough were undaunted and took full advantage of a poor Stortford lineout close to halfway to force their way into the Stortford red zone through their always threatening backs. Two successive penalties took them to the 5 metre line and their forwards were able to force their way over for a try under the posts.

Stortford registered their 6th try after 68 minutes, when a powerful break up the middle by replacement hooker, Harrison King found Manu Vunipola in space on the home 22, but with defenders still to beat. The flyhalf showed great presence of mind to turn the retreating defenders, cutting out to the left and taking the last tackler over the line. Banks converted to stretch the lead to 24 points, but still Loughborough came back, though they were perhaps fortunate to be rewarded 6 minutes later with a second penalty try, when Duff, attempting to cut out a long crosskick was presumably considered by the nearby assistant referee to have deliberately knocked the ball into touch, for which he was yellow-carded and officials clearly felt that the home winger, flying in on the outside would certainly have gathered the difficult kick.

Stortford were reduced to 13 men for the final 4 minutes of the game, when Hankin was penalised 3 minutes later for what was considered a late and noarms challenge on the Loughborough left wing.

Stortford's 13 men bounced back onto the attack, but a knock-on was quickly seized on by Loughborough's lively backs, who dashed some 50 metres upfield. When they were stopped by good cover defence, they ruthlessly exploited the inevitable space out wide on the opposite wing with a pinpoint cross kick from flyhalf, Charlie Reed flying into acres of space, such that the winger was able to allow the ball to come to a stop over the line, before touching it down for his side's own bonus point. The conversion was missed and the game was closed out a couple of minutes later, when the home side offended at a breakdown some 30 metres from their line, as Stortford again threatened with their running game. Banks calmly slotted the goal to bring the final score to 26-41

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150.000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of on-going budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch,
- Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance,
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches,

- Rabbit fencing.
- Replacement of goal posts,
- Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams,
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- Junior coaching courses.

On the social side there are annual Members' events. Currently these are:

- A self-supporting golf day at one of the local golf clubs.
- An Annual Dinner and Forum.
- A First Team Home lunch.
- A First Team Away coach trip and lunch.

FIVE MORE 'FASCINATING' FACTS THAT YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT BSRFC

For several seasons after its formation Bishop's Stortford had a pre-season match with the famous Blackheath Club.

On their first visit to Silver Leys in 1937, Blackheath "lost 2 Players en route." In fairness it must have been a bit of a trek back in those days!

2. Bishop's Stortford won their League in the very first season 87/88 by winning 9 of the 10 Games and thus gained promotion into London 2 North.

But In the 14 seasons until their next promotion they finished in runners-up spot on no less than 5 occasions. It is a sobering thought that the clubs gaining promotion in those 5 season none have achieved to level of Bishop's Stortford and in some instances gone backwards:

- •1988-89 Cheshunt now back at London 3 North West (Level 8)
- •1990-91 Eton Manor now London 1 North (Level 6)
- •1996-97 Cheshunt see above
- •1997-98 Woodford now London 2 North East (Level 7)
- •1999-00 London Nigerians withdrawn from Leagues

3. Bishop's Stortford are the only club to achieve the County Cup and County 7's 'Double'

League In the days before Leagues the main accolade for Clubs was the County Cup played on a knock out basis. In Season 1971-72 Bishop's Stortford RFC completed "The Double" of County Cup and County 7's and remain the only club to have achieved this distinction.

4. Colts rugby was started here in 1960 and was soon followed by the other youth age groups.

Regular attendees at matches will be aware that we are proud of the fact that many of our 1st Xv players are 'home grown'

Since that time we have won the National Colts Cup twice. Firstly in 2006 with a squad that involved Marcus Cattell, Richard Gill, Aaron Springham & Rupert Cooper and again in 2013 by the team that included Charlie Kingham, Oli Jones, Joss Linney, Ben Harrison-Price, Sam James & James Orbart.

We have also won the National Colts Plate victories on two occasions in 2005 (Tom Coleman, Sam Whiffen, Gilly & Matt Tomlinson) and 2011 (George Cullen, Tom McCrone, Tom Banks, Rory Young, Jack Scantlebury, Will Roberts & Tom Cattell)

5. Significant birthday for Minis soon?

Our Minis rugby section was formally established in 1977 but had existed in an ad-hoc fashion for several years before that. So as we have started planning for the club centenary they had soon better start thinking how they are going to celebrate their Golden Anniversary
