When I first moved here from Australia I started coming to BSRFC to play touch. But I got more than I bargained for when, pretty quickly, it turned into a home away from home.

I've ended up with a whole family in Stortford. There's my boyfriend Tommy Cattell who plays hooker, my child Ben Law, my second mum Juliet Scants and about seventeen dads and countless friends (they know who they are).

I grew up watching my dad, and then my brother, play rugby league in our home town near Sydney - it's one of the things I miss most about home. So nothing makes me feel more at home than cheering on the Blues from the touch line of the second team pitch.

Stortford's #OneClub offers a truly welcoming, community vibe whatever game you're watching. But standing by the first team pitch, you're just one face in a sea of a thousand or more, one voice in a chorus of "Oh Stort are we". And while that is undeniably exhilarating, I personally prefer to cheer on the twos. Sometimes you're one of only a handful of parents and girlfriends. It's far more intimate (and easier to heckle... I mean cheer them on!)

You get to know all the players and fellow supporters by name. As the seasons go on, you see lads come up through the threes or get their first senior start after Colts. You feel proud when one of the boys gets the

call up to the First XV or when somebody else is named in the starting side for the Twos for the first time after a season of warming the bench.

The second team offers an entertainment value that you just don't get from a chocabloc first team pitch. Whether it's Scants' infamous one-shoe try, touchline scuffles or the Richmond coach pacing up and down saying "great rugby Richmond" for the entire game.

But ultimately the very best thing about being the girlfriend of a Blues player is when the boys let me carry the industrial-sized bag of Haribo sweets back to the sheds. There's usually none left by the time we've crossed the pitch. Sorry to all the parents whose children I've plied with the sweets...!



TODAY'S OPPOSITIONPLYMOUTH ALBION RFC



The present club was founded in 1920 from a merger between Plymouth RFC and Devonport Albion RFC (both founded in 1876). Since 2003 they have played their home games at The Brickfields stadium.

After thirteen seasons in the Championship, in 2015 they were relegated to National One.

Albion were a major force in English rugby union in the 1920s having five internationals on their books at one time. Around this time they attracted a crowd of 18,000 to a midweek game against Oxford University which established a record crowd for a club match in England which was not exceeded until the 1980s.

On their way to promotion to Nat One in 2002, the team went on a two season unbeaten streak of over 50 games, starting when the club was in Division Three South.

Albion have experienced financial problems of late and only avoided entering administration

early in 2015 following a cash injection of £250,000 by local businesses. That though did not save them from formally entering administration in April 2016 at which point two former players, Bruce Priday and David Venables came to their rescue. However by going into administration they incurred a RFU penalty of a 30 point deduction. This resulted in them finishing 5th at the end of the 2016/17 season instead of clear Runners up to Hartpury.

Last season they finished 3rd winning 20 of the 30 games including twice against us, 36-17 on their first ever visit here to Silver Leys & then 17-10 on a snowy day back at Brickfields. Hence they started the season as one of many people's favourites for promotion. It hasn't quite panned out that way though as they've had a bit of an 'up & down' campaign to date. They currently sit in 7th position having won 11 of their 21 games which includes a last gasp 23-19 win over us in Devon in October.

Our goal today therefore is to record our first ever victory over them. We live in hope!





MATCH REPORT

ESHER 14 - 27 BISHOP'S STORTFORD 1ST XV



Stortford, playing into the breeze, had to withstand some early Esher pressure but their proud defence was up to the task and they were soon on the attack, immediately finding a chink in the home side's own defences. This came after 9 minutes, when Stortford forced their way into the Esher 22 and a perfectly judged grubber kick from George Cullen across the line allowed Joss Linney to dash in and touch down for a vital try. Tom Banks stepped up with a very good conversion into the breeze from out wide to establish an early 7 point lead.

The visitors steadily took control of the game and despite a nasty-looking leg injury to Charlie Kingham, kept the pressure on. After 26 minutes, Stortford won a 5 metre scrum, as a forward drive was held up over the line and a quick break off the back of the set piece from replacement No 8, Steve Ball and a simple pass to Nick Hankin was enough to allow the fullback to dummy his way over for a try. The conversion attempt went wide, as it did some eight minutes later, when Dec Caulfield touched down, driven over from a 5 metre lineout, after a tremendous run by Linney had made inroads deep into Esher's half.

Within 5 minutes, though, the home side had registered their own converted try, taking advantage of some uncharacteristically weak Stortford tackling to burst up the middle and allow Kariym Irving on the wing to break two tackles and touch down out wide.

The visitors bounced straight back from this setback and, within a couple of minutes had

registered their bonus point
try - again through Linney, who
this time put in his own long grubber kick, after
being given space by Hankin and had just enough
pace to win the extremely close race for the
touchdown. The conversion again went wide and
there was enough time left in the half for Esher to
exert some considerable pressure on the Stortford
defence. The home side managed to find some
real rhythm and ran through many phases to test
the visitors' tackling commitment and ability to
the full. Reverting to type, though, the defence
proved up to the task and the half finished with
Stortford 22-7 in the lead.

The visitors started the second period strongly, but a few errors, occasionally unforced crept into their game and prevented them from running away with the game. Nevertheless, the next score did go to Stortford, with Linney completing his hat-trick of tries after 20 minutes, with another chip and chase, after he had been given a one on one chance by a deft, first-time pass from George Keen, following a crucial turnover on halfway from Caulfield. This time, the winger won the race for the touchdown comfortably, but the conversion attempt, once again, went wide.

Esher refused to give in and, cutting out earlier handling errors, enjoyed much more of the ball and gained visibly in confidence, as their back play started to click. They repeatedly threatened with some elusive running and sharp interplay, especially down their right flank and eventually scored a deserved try after 30 minutes through replacement scrumhalf, Jack Walsh, Owen Waters made a great conversion from the touchline and briefly his side seemed to be lifted by this success. Stortford managed to weather the storm, though and might well have added to their tally, had they been able to show a little more composure at the end of a couple of threatening moves. They were able, though to see the game out without any further alarms and send their many travelling supporters away with broad smiles on their faces.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT:

FIRST XV flanker Dan Elsom spoke with new recruit Seko Kalou to find out how he ended up in Bishop's Stortford, and how he's been finding things since arriving at Silver Leys:

DE: Seko, we already love having you at Stortford. How have you found your time at the club so far?

SK: I've really enjoyed my first two months here. I had already heard a lot about the club from a few mates, and everything I have witnessed has been really positive.

DE: Tell us, how did you end up in Stortford in the first place?

SK: I first got in touch with the club through Dan Leo. We used to play against each other a bit when he was playing for Samoa. I was here on holiday and had been in touch with Dan, who asked me if I was keen to play while I was over here. I was, but it was a bit of a struggle to play in National One with my visa.

Dan had a yarn with Longy and got me involved with Stortford. I'm very thankful to the club for giving me the opportunity and for working with Dan and Longy to help get my visa sorted.

DE: So, what were you doing before you arrived in Stortford?

SK: Before I came here, I hadn't played for about six months. I was in New Zealand in 2017, and that was the last time I played rugby. I was over here with my wife. We live in north west London, and we are expecting our first born at the end of April – a baby boy.

DE: Can you give us a bit of an overview of vour career so far?

SK: I've been around a bit. I started off in Fiji, before moving to New Zealand to play club rugby there. I managed to climb up the ladder to provincial level with Otago and then moved on to the Highlanders squad. I've also played in the Heartland championship for North Otago and Wanganui. From there, I got my first Fiji cap in 2009.

The following year, I moved to France for a few seasons, followed by a season in Italy, then back to New Zealand, which was where I last played club rugby.

DE: And what about your international career?

SK: For Fiji, I played a couple of IRB sevens series, and played 16 caps in the 15s. I also went to the 2011 World Cup. I got to play against England at Twickenham in 2012 and scored a try, which was one of my career highlights. I played lock with my younger brother in that game, which was very special. He now plays for Northampton and is aiming to make the next World Cup in Japan with Fiji.

SEKO KALOU

DE: Okay, so what are your plans for the next few years?

SK: I'm coming to the end of my career, and will probably look to call it a day after another two seasons. After rugby, I'd love to do something with coaching or study personal training.

I've been doing my level one coaching course with World Rugby, but I'll still need to refresh and progress up on to level two and further. The club has kindly offered to help guide me through that. I'm looking forward to staying with the club for the next two or three years until I hang up my boots.

DE: How do you see the rest of the season unfolding for the first XV?

SK: We've been so unlucky the last few months, we have just been missing out by a few points. We managed to improve on a few areas and we got the reward against Sale. If we can continue to do that, then we should pave a good path onto the rest of the season. The energy level at training is great; the boys are really keen which is impressive. Our preparation is very important, but if we can continue to have that attitude towards training then we will go on a run.

I'm very happy to be at the club, and I've seen great things since I arrived. It's very impressive to find out that around 60 or 70 per cent of the first team has been playing here since they were kids, and that should be a factor that pushes us on to succeed.

Fun Fact: Along with playing both 7s and 15s rugby for Fiji, Seko has also represented his country in Archery and men's netball, and was even named Fiji's male netballer of the year in 2016.

THE OVAL CLUB



The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:

'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of on-going budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch,
- Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance,

FINANCIAL FUTURE FAR FROM BRIGHT FOR COMMUNITY GAME JOHN ALLANSON

Those of you who read the Rugby Paper will be aware that in recent months I have been a regular contributor to the letters section on the topic of what I believe is the unfair distribution of RFU funds between the "professional game" (Levels 1 and 2) and the rest.

Partly as a result of this, three of us from the Club recently met Graeme Cattermole, former RFU Chairman at his request to give him an insight into the funding that a club like ours, with our Firsts playing at Level 3 can expect from the RFU. It may surprise some of you to know that Twickenham's contribution towards the Club's running expenses this season has been less than £9,000. This comprises a contribution towards team travelling costs (related to the distances to be travelled by our Firsts), less a deduction for the cost of First XV match officials. To put this figure into context, our travel budget for the season is almost £22,000. We have, of course benefited from RFU support for many of our facilities investment projects over the years and, thanks, especially to Peter Scarlett's expertise in such things, we have done well out of the limited funding available. Over the last 16 years we have received grants from Twickenham totalling some £200,000 towards total investment expenditures of some £1,000,000 - an average of some £13,000 p.a.

Many of you will be aware that Mr Cattermole has recently found severe disfavour with the current regime at Twickenham over publicity that he and Francis Baron (CBE) have given to aspects of the organisation's published financial figures, which they feel have not been given sufficient prominence in the published reports. Francis is the former RFU CEO generally credited with having put the RFU's finances onto a business-like footing back in the early 2000s.

No effort was made to enlist the Club's support for their campaign for greater transparency in financial reporting, but he did talk us through some summary-level figures, including the following:-

- Cumulative net profits for the years 1999 to 2010 of £18.6m compared with forecast cumulative losses for the period 2011 to 2020 of £44.7m.
- The RFU is forecasting an Operating Loss of £7m for the years 2018/9 (budget) and 2019/20 (Strategic Plan). N.B. Figures are better compared in 2 year pairs to eliminate the distortions to income of having only 2 home 6 Nations matches every other season.
- When Messrs Baron and Cattermole were in office, the target distribution of expenditure was 50:50 between the professional game and the "development" game i.e. community rugby. In 2017/8 this had fallen to 66:34 in favour of the professional game, a ratio repeated in the 2018/9 budget.

Evidence is that the pressures on RFU finances, which led last season to the need for more than 60 redundancies at Twickenham, the bulk of them from club support areas, are unlikely to abate in the foreseeable future and, with expenditures on the professional game being effectively ringfenced through contractual commitments, should any further expenditure cuts be needed, they will have to fall on either more staff cuts or directly on the contributions to community clubs.

Against the above background, you can perhaps understand the concerns underlying my periodic, "Mr Angry of Bishop's Stortford" letters to the Rugby Paper!
