





And then two Saturdays ago saw us host our 22nd / 'Centenary' iteration of the BSRFC Fireworks Display and it's one that for many reasons will go down in the annuls of our clubs history.

The committee's plans thankfully proved effective BUT we couldn't have achieved it without the help of the small army of club

members, friends and supporters that turned out over the course of the day and night to help us make it happen.

High ticket sales always equals bumper profit. But what gladdened my heart, more than the thought of the cash rolling in, was the fact that we managed to mobilise approx. 150 volunteers representing every section and aspect of the club. I'm not sure there are many organisations & certainly not sports clubs that could have achieved that. It really was a brilliant #OneClub effort and one which we should be very proud of. Thank you and well done to everyone involved.

As a result of the efforts of those 150 and the generosity of our sponsor Hanbury Wealth, the fireworks committee will be able to donate a truly amazing £28,000 to the Centenary Appeal fund and in doing so help to create what will be a lasting legacy for many decades to come.



Today's Opposition BIRMINGHAM MOSELEY



Moseley were founded in 1873 by members of Havelock Cricket Club who wanted something to do in the winter months. A year later they adopted their famous red and black colours. They originally played at the Reddings in Moseley but the pressure of trying to compete in the new era of professional rugby caused them financial difficulties and created a need to sell their 125-year home to property developers. After a 5 year spell as tenants at the University of Birmingham they relocated to their current home at Billesley Common.

The Club's so called 'Golden years' were in the 60's & 70's when their fixture list routinely included the top sides in England and Wales, and Moseley players were regularly included in international teams.

When league rugby commenced in 1987, Moseley were placed in the Courage National Division 1, the top division at the time and in 1988 they ended Bath's astonishing run of 22 unbeaten cup matches winning 4–3!

They were though relegated at the end of the 1990–1991 season. The club entered administration in 1998 and 4 years of financial turmoil followed before a new Moseley Rugby Club emerged in 2002. The rescue came too late though to save them on the field and that season they once again endured relegation this time to National Two (Level 3)

They regained their spot in the second tier by finishing as champions in 2006 & there they remained until they were relegated to this league at the end of the 2015/16 season.

Prior to the 2016–17 season, the club changed its name to Birmingham Moseley Rugby Club.

This will be the seventh occasion we have met, having each won 3 of the encounters. In the doomed 19/20 season we lost a nail biter 34-32 up at their place in the September and won here in early January, 29-15.



A big note of thanks goes to all our sponsors for their continued support and generosity.



Match Report

CINDERFORD 55-39 BISHOP'S STORTFORD



Although given a mighty scare by Stortford, Cinderford are not table-toppers by chance and they eventually ran out comfortable winners, building largely on their powerful pack, backed up by an occasionally threatening backline. As a result, the visitors had only a 4 try bonus point to show for a battling performance, based on patience, persistence and accuracy in possession and determination in defence, until wilting late on.

Stortford started brightly and were rewarded with 3 points from a Tom Walker penalty for an off the ball offence by Cinderford after 6 minutes. Within 4 minutes, though, the home side had a 2 point lead, when they returned a poor clearance kick and a good offload saw Jamie Forrester in for an unconverted try. The visitors bounced back and with Dec Caulfield making repeated dents. close-quarters pressure allowed Seb Brownhill to force his way over for a try, converted by Walker after 16 minutes. Within 3 minutes, a try to Rory Banks, supporting a great break from a lineout by Tom Lewis, well converted by Walker, saw the visitors 12 points ahead. The gap was narrowed to 5 on 24 minutes, though, when Will Hendy's dancing feet took him past two defenders, as he stepped inside, with an overlap outside for a converted try. Stortford flew back onto the attack and were rewarded with another Walker penalty after 28 minutes and, four minutes later, were

15 points ahead after a Cole Swannock try, supporting a great break from the base of a ruck by Sam Bryan. Walker again converted. Cinderford showed their mettle, though scoring two tries in quick succession in the last 5 minutes of the half – the first to their right wing after a crucial offload in midfield and the second, a trademark driving maul, which proved unstoppable from a lineout close to the 22. The latter was converted to take the halftime score to 24-27.

Stortford struggled to get out of their 22

in the first 5 minutes of the second period and. were finally punished with another try from a long driving maul, which was well converted. Still. Stortford fought back, despite their scrum now coming under increased pressure, and, after an extended period of possession in the opposition half, a long pass from Dan Cole found Walker unmarked out wide for an unconverted try. Yet another converted try from a Cinderford driving maul 6 minutes later restored the home lead, but only for 6 minutes, when a piece of individual opportunism saw James Apperley finish off another extended period of pressure on the Cinderford line by pirouetting out of a tackle and beating the last two defenders to cross the line for vet another converted try. That took the visitors back into a single point lead, but that was as good as it was going to get, with the powerful Cinderford side, increasingly taking control. Almost inevitably, the crucial fightback started with another try from a driving maul after 32 minutes, followed almost immediately by a hattrick try to second row, Joe Dancer, as Stortford's now weary defence crumbled in the face of a surging Cinderford counter-attack. With time running out, the home side sealed the victory with a penalty from in front of the posts, giving them a somewhat flattering 16 point margin at the end of what had been a pulsating, end to end game.



The Oval Club



The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:

'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of on-going budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch.
- · Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance.
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches,
- Rabbit fencing.

- Replacement of goal posts,
- · Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- · Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams.
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- · Junior coaching courses.










BSRFC Centenary Book

ON THIS DAY - NOVEMBER 12TH



12th November is a significant date for our Club because on that day in 1921 the Club played its first match. It was at the Dunmow Road ground against RAF Duxford, and we won 8-3. The team that day included many founder members including Dr G. E. Burton whose brother H C Burton played for England. C. E. H. Reckitt, an ex-Richmond player, was captain and Dr J. R. Marrack was vice-captain. He played into his 50s and used to walk from Sawbridgeworth to Bishop's Stortford, play 2nd Row then walk home – a round trip of 10 miles which no doubt was fortified by a few beers after the match.

Later in November 1921, the Club had victories against London Scottish 'A' by 21-3 and in that first season also defeated Felstead and Richmond 'B', one of several games against the lower sides of the big clubs including Rosslyn Park 'A', London Welsh 'A' and Wasps VI which was won 9-8. In the season, the Club played 15 games, winning 10 and scoring 258 points


against 121 (only three points for a try and two for a conversion).

At the beginning of November 1971, all four sides had good wins over Tabard: 1st XV 33-10, 'A' 72-3, 'Extra A' 50-4, and Chindits 63-4 giving a cumulative total of 218 versus 21! I

On 24th November 1988, BSRFC IV (the 'Chindits') won 31-18 against Old Albanians. The pattern of experienced players stepping down the sides to support, and encourage Youth and Colts players, begun by Brian Gorman and Bob Green, was by then well established and in the game against UCL Old Boys ex 1st XV players Gould, Taylor, and Lockwood were joined by Colt, Scott Hadfield.

In our four seasons in National One, we have finished one place below today's opponents Moseley once, in 2017-18 when we had the same number of league points and 15 wins to their 14 but only 8 try bonus points to their 13. The next year we finished 9th to their 12th, 72 points to 68. In 2019-20 when the season finished prematurely due to COVID 19, the final league places were calculated based on home and away playing records in fixtures played up to the date of the cancellation. This gave us a position of 11th to Moseley's 13th.

BSRFC Ladies LOSE OUT TO LOCAL RIVALS HARLOW



BSRFC Ladies will regard this as one that got away as they went down 14-24 to a well-drilled but beatable Harlow side at Silver Leys on Sunday (7 November) writes Dave Walker.

First blood went to Harlow as a period of sustained pressure was rewarded by a run-in under the sticks, which was converted. This was followed in short order by a second try out on the right wing to give the Rams a 12-point lead after 10 minutes.

Stortford dug in and worked their way back up field, some direct carrying breaching the opposition's 22. A surging run by back of the match Mia Richey took play down to the oppo's 5 metre line, setting the conditions for prop (and forward of the match) E-J Cappucini to power over. Outhalf Becca Coppen neatly converted, to cut the deficit to 5 points.

Harlow scored next, a turnover in their own half going through the hands for a sprint down the right wing and a fly-hack that was rewarded by a fortunate bounce. The conversion was missed.

Stortford refused to be bowed, and a great break by No.8 Jess Slade took her to within an arm's length of the line. Slade sensibly recycled rather than reaching for the whitewash and the next phase saw Cappucini drive over from short range for her second. Coppen's conversion was good.

Harlow secured the last points of the game with a converted try. Overall, it was a good performance by the home side, but one they'll feel could've gone the other way but for a couple of mo-ments of defensive inattention and a slight lack of accuracy in open play. Plenty of positives to take away; BSRFC Ladies go again.
