







Today's Opposition

LEEDS TYKES



Trying to do justice to the history behind the team currently known as Leeds Tykes in one page is no easy task but here goes. They can trace their heritage back to 1878 with the formation of Headingley FC, who were later to merge with Roundhay RUFC to form Leeds RUFC.

Before we go much further this precis make help you make sense of their many incarnations and what follows

Headingly existed from 1878-1992. Roundhay existed from 1924-1992. In 1992 they merged to form Leeds RUFC which existed until 1998. When they became Leeds Tykes but in 2007 they changed their name to Leeds Carnegie. And then in 2014 to Yorkshire Carnegie. Before in 2020 reverting to being the Leeds Tykes again.

Mike Bidgood who is Mr. Leeds Rugby was involved at the outset with the proposed merger of his club Roundhay and Headingley and to his immense credit he is still heavily involved with the club today.

Leeds RUFC played their first game in the then Courage National Division 3 (equivalent to Nat One today) on 1st September 1992 with a starting XV which fittingly included five from Roundhay, five from Headingley plus five new recruits.

League reorganisation the following season 'relegated' them to Courage Division 4, when interestingly from a local perspective they played Sudbury!!

Another reorganisation at the end of the 95/96 season, when Rugby Union went professional, saw them restored to level 3 at which point they published what was then considered to be a 'very ambitious' mission statement to "make a challenge for the 1st Division in the year 2000". However on 1st January 2000 Leeds were actually top of National One!

Leeds Tykes (mk.1) were part of a historic world first dual code rugby partnership alongside sister club Leeds Rhinos that ran from 1998 to 2007. It was the first time that one business had owned

both a professional Rugby League and Rugby Union club with the sides using joint training facilities at Kirkstall and playing at the Headingley Stadium.

The Tykes gained promotion to the Zurich Premiership for the first time in 2001, and defeated Bath in the first ever Premiership game at Headingley.

They also qualified twice for the Heineken Cup, the first time thanks to a fifth place finish in the Premiership in the 2002-03 season and then in 2005-06 after winning the Powergen Cup at Twickenham. However after five consecutive seasons in the top flight, The Tykes were relegated in 2006

In 2007, it was announced that Leeds Beckett University had taken a majority stake in Leeds Tykes, with the club renamed Leeds Carnegie for their return to the Premiership.

On 9th July 2014 plans were revealed to create Yorkshire Carnegie from the start point of Leeds Carnegie and put in place the foundations to create a sustainable and successful club for the county at the elite level of the game. Ultimately those ambitions sadly went unrealised leading to the club overcommitting

resources ahead of the 2019-20 season. The club went through a CVA and started that season with a decimated squad and were relegated to National One having only won one game.





Match Report

PLYMOUTH 31-17 BISHOP'S STORTFORD



Stortford battle hard in dreadful playing conditions of cold, wet and mud, but too many defensive lapses were exploited by a strong Plymouth side.

Stortford started strongly, but the Plymouth defence held tight and, with virtually their first possession they scored the opening try after 6 minutes, when a speculative kick over the visitors' flat defence bounced kindly for the home side. resulting in a score close to the posts, providing an easy conversion. Worse was soon to come, when, 6 minutes later a penalty try was awarded, after George Cullen clearly knocked on a ball he had little chance of catching, but the long, looping pass seemed far from certain to reach its target on the right wing and, even if it had in the tough conditions a clean catch and try was hardly a given, so the seven points, plus the yellow card shown to the flyhalf looked harsh indeed. Credit has to be given to Plymouth, though for the skill they showed in playing some ambitious rugby up to that point, based on some excellent offloading and handling in the dreadful conditions. Nevertheless, and despite their 10 minutes' one man disadvantage, Stortford rallied tremendously over the rest of the first half and steadily whittled down the deficit to a mere 2 points at the break. as first Dan Powell and then Cullen himself (twice) slotted penalty goals. All followed good kicks, using the strong following wind to great effect, with Dan Smart putting in two excellent positional kicks, the first brilliantly chased down by Alex Gilham and then Cullen registering his first 50-22 touch to set up the crucial attacking positions, where intense pressure forced the errors.

Unfortunately, Stortford's start to the second half was even more profligate than in the first, not only relieving the scoreboard pressure that had been built up when the first period had ended, but conceding two further tries within the first 5 minutes to give themselves a mountain to climb - even though neither was converted. Both came

from some uncharacteristically sloppy defending, with Plymouth's right wing given an overlap far too easily for the first and the second coming from a chipped kick to the same player, given yards of room outside his opposite number. The initial errors were then both compounded by some poor cover tackling. Once again, however, the visitors showed great spirit to fight their way back into the game and a half-break by returning skipper. Sam Winter led to an unconverted try on 20 minutes to fellow centre, James Ayrton, when he rounded off some good, team rugby, by stepping inside and breaking the last tackle to touch down, after his side had gone through several phases in the increasingly difficult conditions. This brought Stortford back within losing bonus point range, but that too was snatched away 7 minutes later, when Plymouth once again, ruthlessly exploited some loose defending to touch down under the posts for a converted try. The visitors, yet again showed their fighting spirit, forcing their way upfield through sheer force of will, but had left themselves too much to do and, even though they were hammering at the Plymouth line at the death, a knock-on in a tackle brought the game to an end.



'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of on-going budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch.
- · Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance.
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches,
- Rabbit fencing.

- Replacement of goal posts,
- · Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- · Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams.
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- · Junior coaching courses.

- First team home and away lunches.










BSRFC Centenary Book

ON THIS DAY - JANUARY



The Club had used the Chequers Hotel as headquarters for some year but in January 1961 the pub closed. The event was marked by 100 rugby and cricket club members conducting a mock funeral procession with pallbearers in frock coats and bowler hats followed by some fifty 'mourners' who traversed along Water Lane, Barrett Lane and into Long's Ballroom, to the surprise of the ballroom dancers!

In the 1960s the Club published a twice-yearly newsletter: here is an extract from that of January 1963 attempting to encourage more volunteers to help with administrative tasks. 'A cleaning rota was introduced on Sunday mornings along with players being asked to prepare sandwiches and so relieve the army of wives and girlfriends. That was a chaotic experiment and did not survive! The following season the ladies were back.

January 27th 1970 saw the first representative game by Chris 'Tubby' Davies playing for Herts 2nd XV at Bury St Edmunds. What can you remember of the game Tubby?


The club had a glorious start to 1972 when, for the first time, they fielded eight teams and they all won. Most notably, the 'Santas' (8th team) beat a powerful Finchley 4th team and the first XV had a welcome and much-celebrated win by 36-3 over St Albans and the 'A' scored 33 points against the same opposition.

January 1981 was notable for the performance of Bishop's Stortford minis in a tournament against Camberley and London Welsh. There were over 130 youngsters in the section of which 90 played in the tournament. There were fine wins by all five sides against Camberley with the U10 A winning 22-0 and the B 56-0: wouldn't be allowed today!

On 12th January 1991, the 1st XV defeated league leaders Barking 25-3 and remained unbeaten in the Courage League to challenge for promotion but in the last game of the season, Norwich took the title on points difference.

January 1997 saw Bishop's Stortford again

chasing promotion beating
Cambridge 16-12 away
and Cheshunt 24-12 at
home. To go second
level on points behind
leaders Thurrock but a
heavy pitch and a heavy
Thurrock pack led to an
8-19 loss which ended
promotion hopes.

BSRFC 70-10 Tabard RFC LADIES MATCH REPORT



On Sunday Bishop's Stortford Ladies welcomed Tabard RFC to Silver Leys in National Challenge League 2 writes Dave Walker.

The visitors got proceedings underway, and Stortford fielded cleanly. Possession changed hands several times with the sides looking reasonably well matched, until the Stortford ladies managed to break from their own five metre line to set up camp in Tabard's 22. A typically powerful run from prop Carleigh LaLonge saw her barge her way over the line to score under the sticks. Outside half Rebekah Coppen slotted the extras in what was the start of a faultless performance from the tee.

The majority of the pressure remained with the ladies in blue and white, and a surging run by Mia Richey saw her dotting down under the posts. Coppen converted with ease to put the home team 14-0 up.

Some balance was restored as a clearance kick from deep in Stortford's 22 was expertly fielded by Tabard's fullback, who arced around the right wing to score under the posts and cut the deficit to nine points. The conversion was narrowly missed, hitting the right-hand upright.

Stortford's response came almost immediately

off the restart, with the home side regaining the ball and breaking the line, Coppen putting in an excellent offload to see Jess Keohane in under the posts. This marked the start of something of a purple patch for the home side, with a well taken try for No.8 Jess Slade followed in quick succession by a second for LaLonge.

The visitors rallied to put a second try over, but the momentum remained firmly with Stortford – a second try coming for Keohane, followed by scores for Eva Radukic and Kate Hazelwood before Keohane completed her hattrick which she also converted - Coppen graciously handing over kicking duties to mark the occasion! Coppen herself concluded the scoring to claim Stortford's tenth, which she duly converted to mark a perfect afternoon with the boot – Mia Richey also claiming a two-pointer during a brief break for Coppen.

The final score was arguably a fair reflection of the home side's performance, which was marked by some slick offloading as well as a power game that kept punching holes in the defence. However, absolute credit must go to Tabard Ladies, who fought to the final whistle, despite being shorthanded and hit by a number of injuries during the course of the game. They did themselves real credit and were a pleasure to host.
