

Mental Health Matters

From a 1st team squad perspective, it's been a very successful pre-season. It's hard to believe that we got started 11 weeks ago but that time has certainly flown and here we are kicking off the new league campaign.

I'm sure Tom, Marcus and the other coaches won't mind me saying that pre-season has been a success. Both in terms of the rugby being played but also with regards to the effort and attitude of the boys both on the training pitch and in the gym. The new players have integrated well into the group and the Canterbury weekend certainly helped with the bonding. At home versus Old Albanians and Hertford we saw evidence of the hard work that the boys have put into training starting to appear in our performance.

From a personal perspective it's been good to be around the group. Certainly, for the first month I spent much of my time observing, listening and forming my own opinions of players. It's been great to see the different personalities, communication styles and leadership skills develop within the squad. As we progressed through pre-season more conversations were had on the specific areas of mental performance that needed developing.

Obviously, I can't give too much away, but from a Mental Performance perspective, we have focused on the aspects of the game we can control. This being our preparation, our performance and most

importantly how we respond to setbacks. This isn't necessarily something that always comes naturally and can often take several months to develop. But as with everything, the more we do something the better we get at it. The boys have very much bought into recognising that it's the 1%'s that will get us across the line in the tough fixtures this year.

I've had the privilege of working individually with several members of the group already. Chatting over coffee, hearing players perspectives of what needs developing. Spending time on the pitch after training working on different skills. Spending time helping set individual goals for the season. Even using my Solution Focused Hypnotherapy to reduce anxiety and over-thinking. Mental barriers to performance can come in many forms and my role isn't restricted to simply making the boys better rugby players. I see my role as supporting them to be better human beings, the bi-product of that, is success on the rugby pitch.

The mental health of our squad and in fact that of the wider club is my priority. We have our affiliation with JOCA and I am always looking at ways in which we can support our community. So, with that in mind please come and say hello! I am always available for a chat and I'd love to meet more of the members whether playing or social.

Today's Opposition

Hull RUFC



Even most Southern rugby fans will know that Hull has two Rugby League sides: Hull and Hull Kingston Rovers but maybe most fans will not know there are also two Hull Rugby Union sides in the National leagues: Hull and Hull Ionians.

Bishop's Stortford have already met Hull Ionians in two different seasons in National One. With Hull's promotion to National One last season this will be the first time Bishop's Stortford play Hull.

The club history of the two Hull sides is complex. Both sides can trace their roots back to Hull and East Riding RFC that was formed back in 1901. In 1989 this club split into two. The bulk of the club merged with another local side, the lonians to form Hull lonians, just over a quarter of the club wanted to remain as Hull & East Riding. Hull Ionians

took the club's existing league status and Hull and East Riding had to start again in the league structure in the bottom tier of the Yorkshire leagues.

Hull & East Riding in 1992 subsequently merged with another local side, Old Hymerians to become Hull RFC and the combined side took Hymerians' league status in North East Division 2.

Hull gained promotion to National 2 North in 2008/09 after winning a play-off against Chester, they then retained their status in National 2 North until the 2014/15 season when they were relegated to National 3 North.

Hull convincingly won promotion back to National 2 North in the 2019/20 season and last season won promotion for the first time to National 1, beating off the challenge of Sedgley Park and doing the double over Hull Ionians in the season.

When you go back over the separate league records of Hull and Hull lonians, you cannot help but wonder what a combined Hull rugby side would have achieved if the split in 1989 could have been avoided. You could say as well that a combined Hull and Hull Kingston Rovers rugby league side would make a very formidable side but that merger, just like the rugby union sides merging is never going to happen.

As Minis Chair, I would love to be able to grow

the number of female players across the section, I believe with the support of the clubs community officer and hopefully a successful Women's Rugby World Cup in October, we can together encourage more females to give rugby a try and to see that it is more than just a contact sport.

Throughout the season the minis section has lots of home and away fixtures, sprinkled with a few festivals, these are great opportunities for the players to put all their hard work from training sessions into practice against other teams. Our new captain - James Ayrton



There is no obvious natural position for a captain to play in a rugby union side. It is a coincidence that James Ayrton, the new captain and Sam Winter, last season's captain both played the centre three-quarter position. There have been a number of very successful rugby captains that have played centre: John Dawes, Will Carling, and Brain O'Driscoll are very good examples. James is far too young to remember seeing John Dawes and Will Carling playing but he is a skilful intelligent centre in their mode rather than a "crash ball" merchant. In the modern game it is the player's leadership qualities, experience, tactical knowledge and personality that are the most important characteristics for a rugby captain and not his position on the field.

On the field the captain has two main roles. One is to decide on the option to either kick for goal or keep attacking by going for touch and the other important role is to act as the team's interface with the referee. Off the field the captain has to act as the middleman between the side and the coaches. There is no doubt that James has the experience and personality to successfully fulfil these roles and the potential to emulate Sam

Winter's success as captain even if he is just starting to get used to the referee calling him over for talks. James can also be relied upon to capably and politely handle the interface with referees.

James did take the captaincy role in three matches last season during Sam Winter's injury and since rejoining the club after playing over 150 games for Cambridge, has the necessary playing experience and has established himself in the Stortford side gaining the respect of the squad and the coaches. James has been recognised as both a skilful and stylish player and unusually for a rugby player, he plays a lot of golf off


a handicap of five and this does confirm he is a sporting allrounder.

James re-joined the club from Cambridge with his brother in the 2019/20 season which was considered one of Andy Long's best "poaching" operations. Andy convinced James that the style of rugby he liked Stortford to play would fit well with his abilities when Cambridge at the time, was going through a number of different coaches and playing styles.

James while playing at Stortford, has been sponsored by Radleys Laboratory Equipment suppliers in Saffron Walden.

There has been a long tradition of brothers playing for Stortford but his elder brother Mike, another three-quarter, retired last season. However, rather than compare the Ayrton brothers with the Banks and Coleman brothers, it could be more appropriate to compare them with the Evans brothers, Max and Thom, who played in the three-quarters for Scotland between 2008 to 2014 and went on to become TV and media personalities. It is not totally unconceivable to imagine James like Thom Evans, both dating Kelly Brook and taking part in "Strictly Come Dancing".

The Oval Club



The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:

'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of on-going budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch.
- · Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance.
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches,
- Rabbit fencing.

- · Replacement of goal posts,
- · Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- Purchase of physiotherapy equipment.
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams.
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- · Junior coaching courses.

On the social side there are annual Members' events. Currently these are:

- A self-supporting golf day at one of the local golf clubs,
- An Annual Dinner and Forum.
- First team home and away lunches.

Through its contributions The Oval Club plays a considerable part in helping the Rugby Club enhance its playing related facilities for the use and benefit of all members of the Club.












Around The Club

Fourth Officials

The TV match coverage of Premiership football will often show a manager berating the match fourth official probably because if a manager abuses the referee or the assistant-referee he will likely get fined. The fourth officials at a Division One rugby match do not get berated by the coaches but the area around the substitute benches can get quite lively during the match.

The fourth official role is defined in the RFU and National Clubs Association (NCA) regulations. It is a club volunteer role and there is no requirement to wear any official kit. The main responsibilities can be split into three categories: touchline activity control ("front of house"), the match activity recording ("tablet man") and liaising with the match officials and the home team and opposition team on match day.

The touchline activity is being the middle man between the match officials and the two sides in substitution and yellow card processing. This is why you can see the fourth official frequently running up to the assistant referees (linesmen) and getting them to inform the referee of any of these actions. The fourth officials do not have any direct contact with the referee during match time.

The recording of match activities is the times of all events during the match. These are the scores, substitutions and disciplinary events. This is generally quite easy in the first half but can become quite hectic with substitutions in the second half of a high-scoring game. Also identifying the scorers is sometimes not that easy especially the away team scorers!

Stortford quickly recognised that it was sensible to split the fourth official role between two volunteers. One "younger" volunteer to do the touchline activities and a "digitally capable" volunteer to record the match events. The club decided to record the match events online directly into the RFU Game Management System (GMS) during the game to avoid a lot of

duplication work after the match. Last season Bit Solutions kindly donated a tablet device to the club, set up by Sam Prior, which has proved far easier to use than the original laptop pc.

After the match in the Stokes Room, the touchline records and match recording are reconciled by the two fourth officials and the match record is signed off by both the referee, the home side and the visiting side.



The fourth official roles are covered on match days by a rota of volunteers with the assignments made by David Royle. The rota consisted last season of David Royle and Richard Evans (tablet) together with Richard Worboys, Tom Brady, Tim Dedman, and Gareth Tubbs (touchline). Along with the new tablet, the fourth officials also now have their own WhatsApp group so are moving with the times.

The very first club fourth official was David Lockwood who in the early stages of the RFU fourth official requirements somehow managed to do everything himself.

There have been some interesting fourth official stories. Andy Long would like to watch the match from behind the posts and during a home against Ampthill, the Stortford fourth official was requested by Ampthill to tell Andy that as the coach he could not watch the game from behind the posts. The fourth official sensibly replied, "you can tell him yourself".


