

Welcome to the new season!

Moseley were founded in 1873 by members of Havelock Cricket Club who wanted something to do in the winter months. A year later they adopted their famous red and black colours. They originally played at the Reddings in Moseley but the pressure of trying to compete in the new era of professional rugby caused them financial difficulties and created a need to sell their 125-year home to property developers. After five years as tenants at the University of Birmingham they relocated in 2005 to their current home at Billesley Common, Yardley Wood Road, Birmingham.


The Club's so called 'Golden years' were in the 60's & 70's when their fixture list routinely included the top sides in England and Wales. Moseley players were regularly included in international teams.

When league rugby commenced in 1987, Moseley were placed in the Courage National Division 1, the top division at the time. in 1988 they ended Bath's astonishing run of 22 unbeaten cup matches winning 4-3!

They were though relegated at the end of the 1990-1991 season. The club entered administration in 1998 and 4 years of financial turmoil followed before a new Moseley Rugby Club emerged in 2002. The rescue came too late though to save them on the field, that season they once again endured relegation, this time from National One (Level 2) to National Two (Level 3).

They regained their spot in the second tier by finishing as champions in 2006, there they remained until they were relegated from the Championship (Level 2) to Division One (the new name for Level 3) at the end of the 2015/16 season.

Prior to the 2016/17 season, the club Rugby Club.



Stortford played

Birmingham Moseley for the first time when we went up to Division One in 2017/18, for that season and the next two seasons both sides won a game each.

In season 2021/22 Moselev finished just below us in the league, we completed the double on them for the first time by winning 33-3 home and winning 17-29 away.

Last season 2022/23 we beat them at home 29-23 and came back after a very poor first half to finally get a 34-34 draw at their place.



Scrum half, Jas Bice, picked straight from the scrum down the back line which saw outside centre, Lianna Kearns, make an incredible line break into their 22. Some more perfectly timed offloads led to try number two from Yas.

Aylesbury restarted again and an early penalty conceded by Stortford lead to Aylesbury's first try of the match which was unconverted.

With their heads held high, Stortford restarted the game with some more guick offloads and found another gap in the oppo's defence, leading to Stortford's third try by Morgane Geary-Warne, in her first game with Stortford.

Aylesbury restarted and carried strong, passing out wide to their winger, scoring their second try which was converted, leaving Stortford two points behind at half time: 15-17.

The second half started with an early knock on by Aylesbury giving Stortford the scrum. A lovely pick and go by captain, Jas, scored under the posts and converted by EJ

Cappuccini. Some excellent tackles made by the Radukic sisters. Christina and Eva. and Hannah Stoner (debut), as well as strong line breaks and teamwork between Harriet Creasy (debut) and Morgane: but an unfortunate knock on leads to another Avlesbury scrum.

This was quickly turned over by Jas, with a perfect offload to EJ and Charlotte Wheeler. who ran it over the try line. Aylesbury restarted by kicking the ball into the hands of

Yas, who pressed down the pitch straight into Aylesbury's 22, before

offloading to Eva who pushed through all their defence. Another perfectly timed pass to Charlotte saw her second try of the game.

Another knock-on from the opposition saw the teams enter another scrum, allowing Yas to pick and go from the back and before offloading to Jas, who takes the ball to the ground. With quick thinking, Yas grabbed the ball before off-loaded straight to Isabel Scott - another debut in blue - who scored in a clear run under the posts. A quick restart from Aylesbury saw them passing out wide again to their #11 who scored under the posts with no conversion.

With lots of hard work, grit and determination, BSRFC Women took the win in their first game of the season with a comfortable 37-22 at the final whistle

Match Report: Richmond Saxons vs Bishop's Stortford Blues

Blues made a fast start with Tommy Walker getting the first try in the opening minutes of the game, Walker then successfully converted.

The Blues applied pressure again quickly with another two tries coming in short succession with Kai Philips and Dan Powell adding their names to the score sheet. Both conversions made by Tommy Walker, giving the Blues a 21-0 early lead.

After a dominant scrum from the Blues, Finn Quinn created quick ball for Dan Cole as the backs took it wide to Charlie Parkhouse who opened and scored another try - this would not be Parkhouse's last. Conversion made by Tommy Walker.

Good phases followed through the forwards and out to the backs with Parkhouse getting his second try.

Richmond changed kicker as the Blues waited to receive from kick-off. After a good take by Mason Nichols, Blues created a strong ruck and Dan Cole looked to exit. The Richmond fullback took it and ran it back up. Looking to pass, the ball was intercepted by Tommy Walker who ran it straight under the posts for his second try. Another conversion for Walker, 42-0 Stortford.

Blues got a lineout on Richmond's 10m line, a great throw in by hooker Jack Hussey and catch from Mason. Reece Lane waiting out in the backs ran a great line off Dan Cole with skipper Lane scoring under the posts. Conversion successful 49-0.

Another dominant scrum with the Blues pushing Richmond back. Good hands through the backs again. Dan Powell kicked for an exit creating chaos in Richmond's set up. Not long to go till the end of the first half. Good defence from the Blues with Gabriel Sereki getting a turnover. Dan Cole kicked for lineout on Richmond's 10m line. Successful lineout and backs playing wide spotted Jamie Hoyes who smashed through Richmond's defence

for another Stortford try. Followed by Stortford first

unsuccessful conversion, then the whistle blew for half time. 54-0.

The second half began with a few changes to the Blues. A few passages of play from the Blues then Dan Cole kicked cross field to Parkhouse who sped past the Richmond defence 59-0.

The Blues seem set to win here with a dominating performance in the first half. And starting the second half the same way. However the Blues started to switch off a little bit as complacency set in in the defence and Richmond exploited with two quick tries and one conversion 59-12.

Blues still held most of the possession but looked complacent after such a dominant first half. Richmond's lineout in Stortford's 22, Richmond hadn't had hardly been there during the game, but they capitalised, and their second row picked up the ball and scored their third try.

Stortford still hadn't fully switched on and Richmond Saxons looked to catch up, getting another 3 tries, taking the score to 59-33 to the Blues.

Blues finally switched back on and created a turnover from Parkhouse in the last 3 minutes, leading from a quick tap and go then out wide, returning the ball to Parkhouse to score the final try of the afternoon. Dan Cole converted successfully.

Final score 66-33 to the Blues.



Richmond 50 Bishop's Stortford First XV 40

Stortford started slowly and Richmond's powerful backs took full advantage of some slack early tackling to score two tries within the first quarter of an hour.

The visitors pulled a try back on 25 minutes, with Harrison Langworthy touching down at the base of a try-line ruck, after a quickly taken free kick had caught Richmond on the hop. Matt Riddington converted, but the home side restored their 12 point lead only 3 minutes later from a long 50-22 kick. bouncing marginally in play, leading to a lineout drive over the line, extremely well converted by Sean Kerr, one of a powerful pair of centres, who threatened throughout the game. The scores were levelled, though, within 10 minutes with two smartly-taken opportunist tries. The first came from Chris Bolton, taking a quick penalty to catch the home defence napping for once and sprinting over from almost halfway. The conversion went wide, but Bolton nailed an excellent kick after the second try from a driving lineout maul, when a testing rolling kick from Riddington had forced a retreating defender to kill the ball at the breakdown. Having clawed their way back into the game, however, sloppy play from Stortford at the restart turned the ball over immediately at the base of a ruck and a single, simple pass was all it needed for Richmond to register another converted try. Not content with this. as first half time was running out, the home backs once again took full advantage of some more loose Stortford tackling out wide. to send their side into the break 14 points ahead.

Richmond were 19 points up within 8 minutes of the restart with a try from another driven 5 metre lineout, but 3 minutes later Bolton registered Stortford's bonus point try, after Austin Pope had driven a couple of defenders several yards back and then managed to

offload from over the line for the scrumhalf to dot down and then to convert. Stortford



looked more threatening with ball in hand after the break, moving the ball more quickly and less predictably. Richmond's defence, though, stood strong, withstanding several minutes of pressure on their 22. Unfortunately, the visitors' defence once more suffered by comparison with that of the opposition and two quick tries to the home side after 66 and 70 minutes sealed the victory. The first came all too easily when Richmond's 7 broke from the back of a lineout some 30 metre's out, dummied past the first defender and sprinted in untouched and the second also came off a lineout, when poor cover round the fringe of a ruck produced another easy backrow try. Having gone 24 points behind, Stortford dug deep, showing their usual fighting spirit and launched themselves into drive after drive on the home 22, forcing two yellow cards against Richmond's 7 and 8 for cynical offences at breakdowns. In between, Alex Rayment had crashed over for a try from the base of a ruck from a 5 metre lineout with 71 minutes gone. Connor Lloyd converted with a guick drop kick in the guest for further scores, but it took until the final minute for this to come, when Ben Harrison-Price forced his way over through three defenders. Bolton again converted to round off a topsy-turvy match, with the hosts running out deserved winners.

Chris Bolton

Chris plays scrum half for Stortford and traditionally a rugby scrum half only has an easy job when playing behind a dominant pack. At Stortford the scrum half rarely has an easy game as Stortford's up tempo all action fifteen-man style of rugby requires constant quick and accurate play at scrum half. Last season in his first season at Stortford Chris was able to more than fulfil this requirement either when starting games or coming off the bench in the second half of games.

Chris joined Stortford after a season at Burv St Edmunds playing in Division Two South. He played scrum half at Campion School in Hornchurch, he has also played a season of rugby in Australia for the Tumut Bulls. Tumut is in New South Wales at the foot of the Snowy Mountains, one of the colder areas in Australia, Chris needed to play rugby there to keep warm. Following that he spent two seasons playing for Renwick in the Marlborough province of New Zealand. He had games for the Marlborough provincial side, the average Stortford supporter will know the Marlborough area better for its Sauvignon Blanc wine than its rugby. Chris has also been a PDG development coach at Saracens, then coached at Ipswich school and is now head of rugby at Coopers Company and Coburn School in Upminster.

Chris is very good technically at scrum half and has the full range of scrum half skills of passing, kicking accurately from the base of scrums and making breaks in open play. In true modern scrum half fashion, he instructs the forwards to join the back of mauls to provide the platform for his kicking and does not get flustered by the referee's requests to him to play the ball. (As an aside I often wonder if the referees extract revenge for ignoring these "play the ball" requests by making a point of frequently calling Chris back after taking quick tap penalties that would have provided Stortford with an attacking advantage). Chris also fulfils his required tackling duties in defence, his support

roles in attacking play brought him four tries last season despite rarely playing a full eightyminute game.

The Stortford style of all action play and its demands on the scrum half makes it sensible to share the workload between the regular two scrum halves of Chris Bolton and Connor Lloyd. After all scrum halves are just as likely to get tired as front rows and potentially lose some sharpness in the second half of games. This was a very successful tactic employed by Stortford in the majority of games last season which helped ensure Stortford finished games at a consistent high tempo.



The more observant of Stortford supporters would have noticed that this season Chris is supporting a new "perm" hair style. The jury is out on whether Austin Pope and Charlie Parkhouse will copy this hairstyle move as they did copy his original shaven head look.





The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:



'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £150,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of ongoing budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch,
- · Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance,
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches,
- Rabbit fencing.

- · Replacement of goal posts,
- · Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- · Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams,
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- · Junior coaching courses.

On the social side there are annual Members' events. Currently these are:

- A self-supporting golf day at one of the local golf clubs.
- An Annual Dinner and Forum.
- First team home and away lunches.

Through its contributions The Oval Club plays a considerable part in helping the Rugby Club enhance its playing related facilities for the use and benefit of all members of the Club.



Maintenance of the rugby pitches at Silver Leys

These days there is a lot of work and planning that goes into the maintenance of the rugby pitches at Silver Leys. The first XV pitch is the show case pitch, it must be in the best possible condition to reflect the club's status in Tier Three of English rugby.

Arguably it is this pitch that reflects the playing status of the club because it is the first thing that visiting sides and their supporters cannot avoid noticing when they visit Stortford. The appearance and quality of the rugby playing surface has to make a good impression, its condition has to match the club's ambitions for Division One rugby.



It is Gareth Davies of Garsons that has responsibility for the impression the pitch makes, along with the responsibility for the maintenance of the second team pitch and all the back pitches. Talking to Gareth you quickly realise that his work is a vocation and that good groundsmen

have to regard their work as a combination of a calling and a science.

In recent times there has been a technical revolution in both pitch preparation and

maintenance in the English Football Premier League with English groundsmen now regarded as the superstars of European football ground maintenance. The high skill levels of Premier football require the best possible playing surfaces, although the rugby ball is handled and not rolled on the pitch like football, the rugby player still requires the best of playing surfaces to maximise their manoeuvrability and to avoid any unnecessary injury. The

many recent technical advances in sports turf management from

football have spilt over into rugby.

The groundsman now has to know about the levels of sand and moisture in the pitch, the right pH values, the right drainage regime, the right fertilizers and the ideal grass height. You only have to watch Garsons' GPS driven pitch line marker robot in operation at Stortford to appreciate how technical innovations are becoming part of the everyday maintenance requirements for rugby.

There are still the weather changes and the season variations to deal with plus in these times, there are also budget restrictions to manage. Gareth started as the deputy groundsman over twenty years ago at West Ham and has moved with the times to set up Garsons Ltd. See their advert in the program to appreciate that a groundsman only occasionally uses a pitch fork these days.

On seeing our pitch, Dan Leo the experienced Samoan International who started playing for Stortford in our first Division One season in 2017/18 remarked that if he had always been able to play on such a quality pitch it would certainly have prolonged his playing career.

Stortford strife to maintain our position at the top of Division One and Garsons can certainly claim to match this endeavour with the high maintenance standard of our home pitch.


