



Introducing the Club Rugby Committee

'Oh what splendid news', I hear you cry, 'another committee!' - well this one is different. trust me.

From the proper littluns at the start of their rugby journey in the U6s right through to the gnarly, cauliflower ears of the Chindits, one thing is certain - coaches matter. What's more, brilliant coaches are the heartbeat of the club, fundamental to the club's wealth of players by helping create an enjoyable yet competitive culture which promotes progression from junior to senior squads. This helps BSRFC stand out as one of the few clubs able to send out five senior teams on a Saturday and two teams from every age group from youth on a Sunday, not to mention the few hundred minis enjoying their sport here.

But we can't rest on our laurels and the club needs to be progressive. Our sport seems to be on the wane in some local schools too, which have historically been important in bringing in players from Year 7 onwards, so a doubling-down in efforts to avoid

future player number issues needed addressing now.

We have, also, in recent seasons (big shout out to Covid) relied on our coaching teams to upskill themselves; no thanks also to the dearth of official RFU coaching sessions available locally. This has in turn meant they have almost been forced into age group and squad silos, looking inwards

Fortunately the club now has plans in place to help these coaches look outwards, to take on new ideas and practices which will in turn lead to more varied training programmes helping increase player retention all the way through to seniors. The new Club Rugby Committee has been created by bringing together all our senior coaches alongside former 1st XV captains, to turbo-charge our coaching development offering. By sharing coaching skills and experience to all coaches will increase focus and enjoyment for all ages and breathe new life into coaching teams who have potentially been getting a bit too routine dependent.

We will be asking all of our coaches to support and take advantage of the sessions available and to tap into the wealth of experience the club can provide - never stop learning.

Player support will also form another important aspect of this offering, with a focus on retention of players and recruitment of homegrown talent into the top senior squads at the club.

By securing apprenticeships, jobs and training from local partners, players keen to stay local can also tap into this resource and continue their rugby journey at BSRFC.

Thank you to everyone who has supported the mini and youth bursary fund in its first full season.

We have players in the youth section who have greatly benefited from the fund already.

For those unfamiliar with the project, the fund helps young players whose families are struggling with the current cost of living get into the sport at BSRFC.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

GALE FC

Sale Football Club was founded in 1861 by a team of enthusiastic sportsmen

drawn mainly from Sale Cricket Club and is the fifth oldest surviving rugby club. The club's most treasured possession is a Minute Book from 1865 which included for the first time the ten rules to be followed by all players and it is believed to be the world's oldest existing rugby rule book.

The club's famous Heywood Road ground has been home to them since 1903.

Over the years, Sale FC have featured many prominent international and county players including Fran Cotton, Steve Smith, Dewi Morris, Richard Trickey and Jason Robinson.

Sale Sharks, the professional premiership team, are an offshoot of Sale RFC and moved out of Heywood Road to plough their own furrow in 2003.

This meant Sale RFC had to restart their season of league rugby in 2003/4 from scratch at the bottom of the Northern league structure in South Lancs/Cheshire 4, they progressed steadily through the leagues eventually winning National 3 North in 2014/15 thus being promoted into National 2 North in 2015/2016 season.

Sale RFC were National 2 North champions in 2017/2018 gaining promotion to National 1, this will be their 6th season in National 1. We have only beaten Sale three times in National 1, all at home, having not yet won in Manchester.

We have finished above them twice in National 1, 2018/2019 which was their first season in National 1 and in 2019/2020 the Covid curtailed season.

Last season we lost narrowly 8-7 at Sale in December 2023. We won even more narrowly 22-19 in the home fixture in April 2024 with a penalty in the last minutes of the game that "clearly" either went between the posts or maybe over the posts.

In the 2021/2022 season Sale won at Stortford 35-33 when the Sale kicker managed to make a freak conversion from wide out with a drop goal when the ball had fallen off the tee as he attempted the conversion kick. Those two points for the conversion ended up being the winning margin. Admittedly this was not in the last minute of the game like last season however, the rugby "kicking gods" do find ways of evening these things out in the end.

Sale finished last season tenth position in the league with eleven wins, 56 points. We eventually finished just below them in eleventh position with ten wins and the same number of points after both sides had relegation concerns at the end of the season.

WOMEN & GIRLS: KATE HAWKINS



With England's Red Roses currently positioned as the number one ranked side in the world, and with a home World Cup being hosted in

this country next year, there has been a huge excitement and increased interest around women and girl's rugby. BSRFC capitalised on the momentum and played host to Red Rose (and Stortford born), LIZ CRAKE on Sunday 17TH November.



The women's game in England is already flourishing from the grassroots level through to the elite; the Red Roses are currently ranked the number one team in the world, while the participation number for women and girls have risen to over 40,000. With England hosting Rugby World Cup 2025, the aim is to reach 100k registered female players by 2027.

Noting that Liz is one of our own and with such a great opportunity to promote female only rugby, we thought why just keep the session open to just our rapidly growing womens squad so we opened the gates to any girl from mini's age to our senior squad and managed to get the message out to local primary and secondary schools along with an article in The Bishop's Stortford Independent with the help of Andy Lines, who came along on the day to cover the story. Women and girls of all abilities were encouraged to attend and gain from the benefits of some coaching from our amazing mini, youth and senior coaches along with the added benefit of Liz Crake stepping in with each section!

Luckily the weather held (albeit a tad chilly once the sun had gone down) and we welcomed over 75 girls from 6 to 17 and women of any age to discover the joys of rugby with quite a few brand-new faces to the club! Liz was absolutely amazing on the day and impressed with how many girls there were for the "Big Event" and how the club had grown in terms of



women and girls rugby and of course reminisced in the club house checking her name out on the board!

A big thank you must go out to all who made the day happen, from our youth coaches Ed Barber, Rich Cartman, Fred Chate and Bruce Penrice along with our team admins Vicky Seel & Emma Bayliss, Nikki Wilkins - Chair of Mini's who stepped in to Coach along with George Knight who arranged a session for the U7-U9 girls, Kyle McDonald and Dave Walker our senior coaches and our volunteers. Gaz Tracev - Chair of Touch who finished the girls session with a game of Touch so that all could get involved, Cristy Hawkins, Donna McDonald and Maddie Ellwood who helped set up with various much appreciated tasks. 

Esher 14 Bishop's Stortford 1st XV 31

Starting with the strong wind at their backs, Stortford exerted early pressure and.

despite the first thrust at the line being held up for a defending dropout, they were quickly back on the front foot and, recovering a partiallyblocked grubber kick from Dan Powell. Tom Mills and Jack Biard combined to beat a number of defenders for the latter to crash over for an unconverted try with only 4 minutes gone. Five minutes later and it was Sam Johnson who touched down, after more direct, multi-phase rugby in the very testing conditions broke down the home defence. Tristan Smith had been injured in the build-up, but his replacement by Henry Peck did nothing to reduce his side's dominance at scrum time. With 17 minutes gone, more Stortford pressure resulted in a 3rd try, with Alex Rayment touching down at the back of a driving maul after a lineout 10 metres out. This time. Chris Bolton was able to add the conversion for a 0-17 led. Not surprisingly, in the hostile weather conditions, both sides made numerous handling errors and, with hard tackling from both, scoring opportunities were limited. Stortford continued to have the better of the exchanges, but it was only as first half time was running out, that a further converted try was scored, with David Hayes reacting first to take a guick tapped penalty from

another scrum penalty 5 metres out to dodge his way over and register the four-try bonus point.

Playing into the elements in the second period – with driving rain now added to the wind in their faces – the priority for Stortford was to try and control possession. They manged to achieve this goal in an encouraging first few minutes, but a loose

defensive kick after 6 minutes, compounded when a good return kick from Esher was played on its way into touch, resulted in an attacking home lineout, which they exploited to the full to touch down close to Stortford's posts to narrow the deficit to 14 points. The visitors bounced back. though and a crucial try was scored by Chris Bolton after 52 minutes, breaking off the back of a driving maul, after Austin Pope had come close from an attacking position created by a clever grubber kick from the same player. With Johnson in particular making a real nuisance of himself at breakdowns. Stortford more then held their own for an extended period, despite the hostile elements, but, ironically, it was from a particularly threatening run by Tom Mills, taking him close to the Esher line, that a loose offload allowed the ball to be hoofed far downfield, where a knock-on put the home side in possession inside the red zone. Concerted pressure led to a 5m lineout and the defence was caught on the hop by a quick break off the back of the resultant driving maul, with an Esher forward crashing over for the final try, converted by Tom Walker, on as replacement flyhalf against his former club. The visitors, though, had no real difficulty in seeing out the remaining 6 minutes without further threat to their line to seal another important win on a day when Rotherham beat leaders. Rams thus putting Stortford's win up there earlier in the season in an even better light.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: JOSK STANNARD



Josh Stannard first played for Stortford when he was selected on the bench away at Hull Ionians on 19 October 2019. He came on after 50

minutes for Tom Walker and scored a converted try after 58 minutes which reduced a Hull Ionians lead of eleven points to just four points. Stortford then took the lead with a Chris Smith try before Josh then helped set-up another converted try which with another Stortford penalty had given Stortford a lead of ten points however, Hull came back with another penalty. The final score was 39-32 to Stortford with Stortford taking five points and Hull two points with a losing bonus point and a four try bonus point. It was therefore a great high scoring open match for Josh to make his debut. Josh then went on to make thirteen more appearances for Stortford before the season was curtailed in March 2020 by Covid with Josh aetting three more tries.

When league rugby restarted in the 2021/22 season Josh made twenty appearances mainly on the wing but with two appearances in the centre. He scored fourteen tries which included a hattrick against Chinnor at home in April 2022. In the 2022/2023 season he made 21 appearances and scored seven tries, this time all on the wing. His appearances in 2023/2024 were curtailed to eight through injury in December at home against Darlington. This season Josh has again been affected by injury but it is expected he will be fit again and back to his try scoring ways in the second half of the season as Stortford's form continues to improve.





Josh joined Stortford as a centre from Brentwood, his running style with ball in hand on the wing is the "old" classic attacking threequarter style. He will be recognised more as a David Duckham than a Keith Fielding by the older generation Stortford English rugby fan. Most of Josh tries are scored from medium to long distances where through his pace he can exploit open field running opportunities. Once Josh has made a break he is rarely caught from behind and he scores tries that are always easy on the eve. There are very rarely any "who got that try questions" for a typical Josh score. In the modern game with well organised defences the days of the ball been passed along the whole three-quarter line from set pieces looking for openings are long gone but chances still arise from broken play. In the game there will still be chances manufactured by quick thinking and skilful handling and it is then that fast and strong running players like Josh are needed to exploit such openings.

It is the efficient hard worked tries by forwards from close range that win the majority of games today but it is still the type of long range tries that Josh scores that live in the memory and win the "try of the season" awards.

Josh thanks his sponsors, Menor, this season and it could be said that many of Josh's tries are worthy of being framed.

THE OVAL CLUB



The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted

to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:

'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £200,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of ongoing budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch,
- Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance.
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- Drainage of the back field pitches.
- Rabbit fencing.

- Replacement of goal posts,
- Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams.
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- Junior coaching courses.

On the social side there are annual Members' events. Currently these are:

- A self-supporting golf day at one of the local golf clubs,
- An Annual Dinner and Forum.
- First team home and away lunches.

Through its contributions The Oval Club plays a considerable part in helping the Rugby Club enhance its playing related facilities for the use of all sections and members of the Club, including Senior Sides, Ladies & Girls, Colts, Youth, Mini and Touch Rugby







CARDIAC RISK IN THE YOUNG



18 months ago, my family suffered a terrible loss when my brother-in-law died as a result of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest. He was 49 years old.

At the start of this season, our Rugby Club

family lost our friend and teammate **Max Oliver**, again to a Sudden Cardiac Arrest, at just 31 years of age.



The Oliver family wanted to try and make something positive happen from their unimaginable loss and, with the help of Max's friend Spencer

Kersey, set up a JustGiving page to raise money for **Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY)**.

Every week in the UK at least 12 young people die of undiagnosed heart conditions. Since its formation in 1995, CRY has been working to reduce the frequency of young sudden cardiac death (YSCD). CRY supports young people diagnosed with potentially life-threatening cardiac conditions and offers bereavement support to families affected by YSCD.



CRY promotes and develops heart screening programmes and funds medical research.


In agreement with the family, I decided to join with them and have the Memorial Fund for Max with Cardiac Risk in the Young as my President's Charity for 2024-25.

Within 2 months, £41,000 has been raised in Max's memory. If we can achieve £70,000, this would be sufficient to fund cardiac screening for 1000 young people. We hope that a number of the screenings would take place here at Silver Leys and as many of our young members as possible can benefit from the screening.

The match day lunches can be compared to arranging thirteen wedding receptions a season. There needs to be a seating plan, special dietary requirements to handle, and the equivalent of sending out the invitations to confirm all the attendees. The one difference from a wedding is that lunch attendees do have to pay but there is no wedding present list to worry about.

In addition, many of the lunches have "themes" with the Christmas lunch, Remembrance Day,

ex-players, Vice-presidents, "Oval" and "Club Stortford" lunches.

There is also no "mother of the bride" or groom's family involved but the club President and his top table requirements will have to be taken into consideration. The wedding's VIP guests are the corporate sponsors, all in the very capable hands of Julie North. It is essential that when they attend, they are well looked after and have a good lunch experience.




