



CARDIAC RISK IN THE YOUNG

18 months ago, my family suffered a terrible loss when my brother-in-law died as a result of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest. He was 49 years old.

At the start of this season, our Rugby Club

family lost our friend and teammate **Max Oliver**, again to a Sudden Cardiac


Arrest, at just 31 years of age.



The Oliver family wanted to try and make something positive happen from their unimaginable loss and, with the help of Max's friend Spencer

Kersey, set up a JustGiving page to raise money for **Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY)**.

Every week in the UK at least 12 young people die of undiagnosed heart conditions. Since its formation in 1995, CRY has been working to reduce the frequency of young sudden cardiac death (YSCD). CRY supports young people diagnosed with potentially life-threatening cardiac conditions and offers bereavement support to families affected by YSCD.



CRY promotes and develops heart screening programmes and funds medical research.

In agreement with the family, I decided to join with them and have the Memorial Fund for Max with Cardiac Risk in the Young as my President's Charity for 2024-25.

Within 2 months, £41,000 has been raised in Max's memory. If we can achieve £70,000, this would be sufficient to fund cardiac screening for 1000 young people. We hope that a number of the screenings would take place here at Silver Leys and as many of our young members as possible can benefit from the screening.

BURGARY UPDATE: JIM TANFIELD

The cost-of-living crisis hasn't gone away. Even in wealthier corners of the country, including Bishop's Stortford, some families are in

a constant battle to make ends meet.

Parents and carers are having to make the difficult decision to reduce expenditure by dropping their child's sports club subscriptions and in doing so release themselves of all the additional costs involved.

The Youth, Girls and Mini Bursary believes that sport is an essential in a child's life and not a luxury. It can of course be extraordinarily expensive for a child to get fully kitted out for their club as well as getting them to training and matches - with BSRFC youth being in the Herts Middlesex League, away games can be as far out as Teddington, which on an early Sunday morning start in winter feels as if it's practically in Wales! Then let's not forget about tours - and while I am always keen to ensure our age groups don't out price some families with costs and destinations -it all adds up.

For those struggling the Bursary was set up two seasons ago to help with exactly this.

We sort out the players with not just okay kit, or lost property, but kit to be proud of and cherish. Boots, training tops and jackets all good quality.

The Bursary will help the parents with travel costs too, providing a bit of petrol money for away games if an alternative can't be found as well as a bit of pocket money for the player for their visit to the all-important festival burger and sweet stall.

Giving the funding for the player to expand their

love of the game by helping them afford tours without feeling singledout and worried about the cash in their pocket is important to us.

You will not know who the bursary players are, that was our goal, absolute confidentiality, and we have so far achieved a decent level of awards with only the lead coach and Bursary chairman (me) with the names of those being helped.

We ask for nothing in return except they love the sport and if they choose to continue playing, that they choose BSRFC as their home.

However, we need funds to continue this support. We estimate that each player on a full bursary cost around £500-£700 per season and it is difficult to rely on the same donors each season.

And while we appreciate all the other areas of support the club asks for, can we stick out our cap and ask for some donations?

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

Rosslyn Park Football Club were founded in 1879 by cricketing friends in north London in order to keep the players together during

the winter. There was already a Hampstead Football Club (from which both Wasps and Harlequins sprang), so the cricket club's name was adopted, reflecting the area of Hampstead where the cricketers first played their games in the grounds of Rosslyn House. Their original rugby ground was at South End Green, Hampstead, then Gospel Oak and Acton before a lengthy tenure at Old Deer Park, Richmond until 1956, when Rosslyn Park

moved to its current premises in Roehampton.

Originally they wore a blue shirt with white Maltese cross but in 1881 adopted the current red-and-white hoops. It still remains a Football Club, without the need for the word Rugby, and so is correctly Rosslyn Park FC, not RFC.

The club became the first English side to play rugby internationally when they beat Stade Français in Paris on 18 April 1892. In 1975 and 1976, the club played in the final of the John Player Cup, narrowly losing on both occasions

When English league rugby began in 1987, Park was placed in Division Two, which they won. The first team currently play in the third division of the English league system, National League One.

Their clubhouse has two bars, which are named after two of the club's famous players – Andy Ripley and Alexander Obolensky. Our record against them in National One does not make for happy reading. Played 10, Won 1, Lost 9 but the majority of our match ups have usually been close, including an agonising single point loss (14-13) down at Roehampton at the beginning of October 2021. Last season we again lost both games but the result was relatively close at Stortford in February, when we lost 21-27 (but we lost away 48-22 back in November 2023).

Rosslyn Park went on to finish third in the league last season with 82 points and 14 wins, with Stortford finishing eleventh in the league with 56 points and 10 wins.

Match report Datchworth Ferns 0 - 64 BSRFC Women

This weekend, BSRFC Women's XV returned to the field after an extended break

to continue their league promotion campaign.

The match kicked off with a strong start from BSRFC Women, who successfully turned the ball over in their favour within the first 10 minutes. With an impressive display of handling from the back line, the ball made its way to fullback Amy Vernon, who opened the scoreboard with a try, successfully converted by fly-half Rebekah Coppen.

Unfortunately for Datchworth, the kick to restart landed straight into the hands of number 8, Kim Welsh, who set the dominant tone of the game with a powerful run. After a couple of picks from the forwards, flanker Sarah Harvey performed her trademark line-break straight through the Datchworth pack to score a fantastic try, once again converted by Coppen.

As the pressure of the game continued to build, both teams were forced into handling errors resulting in several scrums. Seizing an opportunity, scrum-half Donna McDonald showcased her speed and agility, picking the ball from the back of a scrum to run the entire length of the pitch for another try, with Coppen adding the extras.

Datchworth's strong defence proved difficult for BSRFC Women, who were not in for an easy ride. Phase after phase ensued until a hard hit to winger Alice Borman called for an early substitution, bringing in Grace Rhoden who made her debut in a Stortford jersey. At the lineout, Stortford regained possession before Welsh stormed through to add another try to the tally. Coppen's boot proved valuable again in the conversion.

Despite the scoreline, Datchworth continued to be a force to be reckoned with, testing the visiting side at every given opportunity. Strong collisions led to further substitutions, but a swift pass from the back of a breakdown resulted in the fifth try of the first half from captain Jasmin Bice. Shortly afterward, Harvey scored her second try of the match, which was converted by Coppen, bringing the score to 0-40 at halftime.

The second half saw continued dominance from BSRFC Women who, unfazed by the bitter weather, were passing the ball edge-to-edge to evade and tire the opposition. Another game-breaking tackle into touch by Datchworth resulted in a lineout; although they were unable to compete with flanker Lorell Jordan, who once again stole the ball for a Stortford turnover.

In a bid not to end her season scoring streak, number 8 Kiera Chadburn crossed over the line for another try, converted by Coppen. Crucial tackles from Holly Knight and Larissa Cushway ensured that Datchworth were never on the front foot, forcing the hosts into several handling errors. Working to Stortford's advantage, Coppen scored and converted her own try, followed by a second try from McDonald.

As the match moved into the final phase, Stortford's relentless pressure led to a Datchworth knock-on. The referee blew the fulltime whistle to seal a convincing 0-64 victory for BSRFC Women.



MATCH REPORT: JOHN ALLANSON



Richmond 38 Bishop's Stortford 1st XV 21

Stortford fought a tremendous rearguard action in the first half, getting out of

their own half only 3 times and the majority of the rest pinned down in their own 22, vet turned round 7-14 up. Goal line defence from the visitors was superb, forcing error after error out of the Richmond's all-action table-toppers. After only two minutes, a tremendous interception by Mike Cooke in his own 22 broke up a sequence of attacking phases from the home side and his kick ahead was perfectly judged, just about making the Richmond try-line, where Tom Mills won the race for the touchdown and a 0-5 lead, quickly made 7 by Cooke's conversion. With Stortford struggling to string any possession together and the lineout spluttering, they had to soak up a lot more pressure on their line, but proved up to the huge challenges posed by the home side. A great turnover by Sam Johnson on his own 22 caught Richmond of-balance and a chip kick from Cooke bounced kindly for Mills, who gathered at full pace and was able to gallop clear for his second try under the posts, giving his flyhalf an easy conversion. The home side surged back onto the attack, but Stortford's defence continued to hold tight. With 24 minutes gone, it looked as if the visitors had once again repelled a dangerous attack, when Harrison Langworthy worked his way into the middle of a driving maul from a Richmond 5m lineout to win a scrum. The ball was duly won, but the home scrum half seized

on the ball, as Will Rogers broke off and was able to dive over the line unchallenged. The conversion halved his team's deficit and gave renewed impetus to their stream of attacks. Stortford, nevertheless, dug deep and were able to battle their way to half time without any further concession.

The second period started as almost a mirror image of the first, with Stortford, this time on the attack, but a poor kick chase allowed the home 15 to break free and find a supporting backrow, who galloped over for an equalising try, with barely a minute gone. Worse was soon to come, however. when Richmond's 10 emulated Cooke's first half feat of intercepting a pass on his own 22, though in his case, he had the pace to run clear and touch down himself for another converted try. Richmond pressed again and, after Alex Gilham had been yellow-carded for a deliberate knockon, quickly added their 4th 7 pointer, through their 12. Stortford took similar advantage of a swing in their favour in playing numbers, when the home side saw their 12 and 5 vellow-carded in quick succession - the former for a blatant and forceful high tackle that might easily have incurred a red. Within a minute of the second card, Tom Mills went over under the posts for his hat-trick, after his pack had sucked in the defence with a couple of strong drives from a 5m lineout. Unfortunately for the many Stortford supporters present, their team managed to squander the remainder of their numerical advantage, allowing Richmond to dominate possession and, indeed, add 3 points from a breakdown offence penalty. The remainder of the game was dominated by the home side, who finally managed to turn a period of forward pressure into a try after 74 minutes to seal the result. Stortford battled to try and score the 4th try that would have brought a bonus point, but were unable to break down a strong home defence.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: MICHAEL COOKE



Michael Cooke is 171 cm tall and weighs 82 kilograms; that is nearly optimal for a number 10 (it converts to 5ft 7ins and 12 stone 12 lbs in proper rugby measurements).



Michael joined Stortford at the start of this season 2024/2025, and played in two preseason game wins against Tonbridge Judians and Cambridge. He then played in the first seven league games of the season before doing a stint in the Blues, then returning getting back into the First XV for the recent games against Rams and Rotherham. So far this season he has scored 66 points, with kicks and one try for a total of 71 points. He has had one technical yellow card at Rams somewhat harshly awarded (according to John Allanson's report) for not retreating at a quick tap penalty even though a try was scored.

Michael started his career playing for his local school in Andover, Hampshire and then made a number of appearances for the London Irish Academy sides and joined the Irish pathway process. Michael then went to the famous Sedbergh rugby school in the wilds of the North of England and made a number of U18 Irish side and Irish Sevens appearances while at Sedbergh. He then went to University in West London at Brunel University and joined the Ealing Trailfinders Academy that was associated with Brunel. He was loaned out to play lower league rugby while at university and has also appeared for Esher and Sutton and Epsom.

At the end of his three years at Brunel he went over to Munster to attend Limerick University and joined Shannon RFC in the Irish leagues in the 2023/2024 season. He came back to England the following year and joined Stortford for the start of the 2024/2025 season. Stortford was recommended to him by players he knew from his Ealing Trailfinders Academy days. He now works in Sawbridgeworth and lives locally just across the road from the ground near Tesco.

He has played all his rugby at outside half but did play scrum half as well in his school days in Hampshire. He concentrates on accuracy in his touch line kicking and has a good success rate in conversions kicking for wide out kicks.

THE OVAL CLUB



The Oval Club was formed in 1998 by some Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club members who wanted

to find a way of raising funds to improve the playing facilities of the Club with the mission statement:

'To contribute towards promoting the highest possible standard of rugby throughout Bishop's Stortford Rugby Football Club'

The Oval Club is an autonomous body and entirely independent of the Rugby Club's operations. None of the Committee members hold a position or appointment in the Rugby Club's infrastructure. The Oval Club does not seek to influence decisions of the Rugby Club. It responds to requests for financial assistance for projects which have been approved by the Rugby Club's Executive Committee and which fall within its mission statement.

Funds are raised by monthly contributions from the Members two thirds of which are set aside for Rugby Club projects with the other third reserved for social events for Members.

To date The Oval Club has raised over a quarter of a million pounds with the Rugby Club receiving more than £200,000.

The Oval Club makes contributions to the Rugby Club for one off projects which are of long term value and not part of ongoing budget requirements. Often these contributions have been made to the Club to enable it to secure grants from the Rugby Football Union and other sources.

So far, major contributions have been made towards the cost of:

- Flood lighting the main pitch,
- Floodlighting the back field pitches,
- Pitch repair and maintenance.
- Improvement of the playing surfaces, including the purchase of a verti-drainer,
- · Drainage of the back field pitches,
- Rabbit fencing.

- Replacement of goal posts,
- Refurbishing the changing room showers,
- Purchase of physiotherapy equipment,
- Playing equipment and travel costs for all teams.
- Supporting youth and mini through tours, kit and additional playing facilities,
- · Junior coaching courses.

On the social side there are annual Members' events. Currently these are:

- A self-supporting golf day at one of the local golf clubs,
- · An Annual Dinner and Forum.
- First team home and away lunches.


